# FIM S1GP SuperMoto World Championship

## 2021 Provisional calendar, 22 December

The FIM and XIEM are pleased to present the calendar for the 2021 FIM S1GP SuperMoto World Championship, which includes six Grand Prix and the FIM SuperMoto of Nations that returns to France on the established Carole circuit, which is sure to repeat the 2019 success.

The start of the 2021 season, in agreement with FIM, organisers and teams, has been postponed to the end of May, by which time it is hoped that countries will have come out of the pandemic situation and that it will be possible to carry out all the scheduled races without problems. The opening of the season will be on 23 May, as usual in Italy and then one Grand Prix every month thereafter.

The calendar welcomes the return of the Czech Republic to the new circuit of Vysoké Myto in July and ends in October with a new entry, that being Gibraltar with a very spectacular city track that will include the start and finish inside a stadium.
